Congressman Max Miller Donates \$43,500 to Medina County Career Center to Fund Scholarships for Career and Technical Education Students

ROCKY RIVER, OHIO – Congressman Max Miller has donated one-quarter of his congressional salary, \$43,500, to the Medina County Career Center (MCCC) to fund students' scholarships for career and technical skills training and professional education courses.

Since launching his bid for Congress, Miller has championed the importance of career and technical education. As a candidate, Miller promised to donate one-quarter of his salary to making his district's communities stronger and supporting efforts that make Northeast Ohio a great place to live and work.
