(SOC Code 29-2041) From the Bureau of Labor and Statistics, employment of emergency medical technicians (EMTs) and paramedics is expected to **grow 6% from 2022 to 2032**, faster than the average for all occupations. Emergencies, such as car crashes, natural disasters, and acts of violence will continue to create demand for EMTs and paramedics. The median annual wage in Ohio is **\$44,780**.
