Job Outlook:

(SOC Code 51-4121) Employment of welders, cutters, solderers, and brazers is projected to **grow 2% from 2022 to 2032**, slower than the average for all occupations. Despite limited employment growth, about 47,600 openings for welders, cutters, solderers, and brazers are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Most openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force such as to retire. The median annual wage in Ohio is **\$48,940**.
