Phlebotomy Technicians enjoy stable employment due to their extensive training and practice, and the high demand for their expertise. Typically, phlebotomists are responsible for collecting blood and other samples from patients and preparing these samples for laboratory testing. There are a variety of employment options for phlebotomy technicians in hospital and clinic settings, nursing homes, private home care and insurance or research institutions.

(SOC Code 31-9097) Employment of nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants is expected to **grow by 8% from 2023 to 2033**, much faster than the average for all occupations. Hospitals, diagnostic laboratories, blood donor centers, and other locations will need phlebotomists to perform bloodwork. The median annual wage in Ohio is **\$41,810**.
