Enrollment Process

THE PROCESS:

- Visit mcjvs.axstudent.com to “Register” and complete the online application.
- Complete the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* [FAFSA] form [MCCC ID #015612].
- Schedule the Test of Adult Basic Education [TABE] by calling 330.725.8461, ext. 155.
- Schedule an appointment with the Director of Adult Education at 330.725.8461, ext. 158 to discuss Financial Aid.



POLICIES & PROCEDURES:

All policies and procedures regarding admission, transfer, withdrawal, refunds, and program completion requirements can be found online at www.mcjvs.edu.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

A High School Diploma, High School Equivalent Diploma, General Education Development (GED) certificate or completed secondary-school education in a home-school setting treated as a home school or private school by state law is required for enrollment in the Career Development programs. However, students may enroll without a diploma or GED if they are participating in the Adult Diploma Program [applies to approved programs only] or complete a High School Equivalence Diploma before program graduation.

Students that are foreign nationals and not able to provide proof of a high school diploma may graduate if they attain a composite score of 14 on the WorkKeys tests. Students must pass the TABE assessment test (see Enrollment Process above).

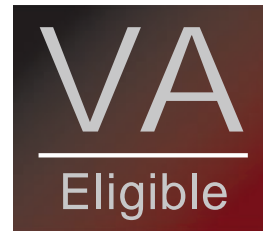

Job & Career Training Programs

Adult Diploma Program

Who qualifies?

Any adult age 20 or older living in Ohio that does not have a high school diploma, a High School Equivalence Diploma or GED.

What do participants receive?

Students will earn a HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA and CAREER TECHNICAL CERTIFICATE when they meet the WorkKeys score requirements for their chosen technical program, complete the course requirements (both academic and technical) and earn the industry credential associated with their technical program of study. The High School Diploma will be awarded from the Ohio Department of Education.

What is the cost for the Adult Diploma Program?

Program costs for qualified Adult Diploma Program students will be paid for by the Ohio Department of Education.

What programs qualify?

- Dental Assisting
- HVAC
- Medical Office Administrative Assistant
- Phlebotomy Technician

What is the process?

- Apply for the program online at **mcjvs.axstudent.com**.
- Indicate on the application that you plan to pay with ADP.



- Call us at 330.725.8461, ext. 155 to express interest in the Adult Diploma Program and register for the academic pretest.
- Meet with the Director of Adult Education to review your score and create a plan, if needed, to work on refreshing areas of academic weakness (usually a 6 to 8-week commitment) with Aspire or Project Learn.
- Register with Ohio Means Jobs to discuss academic skill attainment plans; choose a technical skill focus.
- Create a SAFE account login with the Director of Adult Education.
- You will be asked to provide: a copy of your Birth Certificate, state-issued ID or Driver's License, and a working email.
- Your application will be submitted to the Ohio Department of Education for approval and acceptance into the program, after all steps are completed.
- When you have completed your program, attained the required WorkKeys score, and passed the related industry credential, a High School Diploma is issued by the Ohio Department of Education.

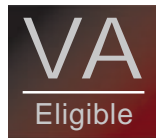


Dental Assisting Helping People Stay Healthy



Picture yourself working right along with a professional dentist taking x-rays, educating adults and children on proper oral hygiene, and creating teeth impressions [models]. This 740-hour program includes 160-hour externship experience allowing you to get first-hand practical application which is invaluable. Qualifying students sit for the National Entry-Level Dental Assistant Exam (NELDA) and the Dental Assisting Radiographer Certification. College credit available through Career Technical Credit Transfer [CT]².

Medical Assisting Care About Helping People?



With the country's aging population, the medical field is literally exploding. This program can help you become a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant where you work alongside physicians, healthcare professionals and patients. This 910-hour program includes 160 hours of Off-Site Observation/Practicum Experience so you go beyond the classroom. Qualifying students will sit for the following certifications: Certified Clinical Medical Assistant [CCMA], Certified Phlebotomy Technician [CPT], Certified EKG Technician [CET], and CPR Certification. This program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs upon the recommendation of the Medical Assisting Education Review Board [MAERB]. 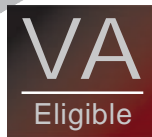

Medical Office Administrative Assistant Organized? Helpful? This is for You!

With the growing medical field, capable administrative assistants with computer skills and medical knowledge are a true asset to any health care facility. Learn and utilize basic computer skills, medical administration, patient registration and admissions, basics of medical insurance and billing, medical law/ethics, terminology and employability skills. Choose from physician's offices, senior care facilities, hospitals, clinics and more. Qualifying students will sit for the Certified Medical Administrative Assistant [CMAA] exam and the Electronic Health Records Specialist [CEHRS] exam, Certified Billing and Coding Specialist [CBCS] exam and CPR. College credit is available through Career Technical Credit Transfer [CT]².

Phlebotomy Technician A Solid Career Choice!

Phlebotomy Technicians enjoy stable employment due to the amount of training and practice they go through and the high demand for their expertise. Typically, phlebotomists are responsible for collecting blood and other samples from patients and preparing these samples for laboratory testing. There are a variety of employment options for phlebotomy technicians in hospital and clinic settings, nursing homes, private home care, and insurance or research institutions. Upon successful completion of the program, students are eligible to sit for the Certified Phlebotomy Technician Examination through the National Healthcareer Association and American Heart CPR. Class size is limited to provide more one-on-one education and training.

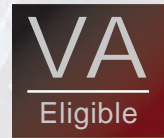

Law Enforcement An Incredibly Important Job



Enjoy making your world a better place? There's no more important career choice than Law Enforcement and this course prepares students to apply for positions such as sheriff's deputies, police officers, and public and private security officers. Learn unarmed self-defense, driving, legal aspects, and patrol and investigation techniques. Candidates must be 21 years of age by course completion. Students sit for the following certifications: Ohio Peace Officer [OPOTA], CPR/AED Certification, RADAR/LIDAR Certification, and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing [SFST] Certification. College credit is available through Career Technical Credit Transfer [CT]².

Emergency Medical Technician

Be a First Line Essential Hero!



This non-stop exciting career includes working on a rescue squad, ambulance service or with a fire department helping people who are in a health crisis. Learn cognitive instruction, communication skills, and hands-on learning. This class is presented in conjunction with the Cleveland Clinic Medina Hospital and has 184 hours of classroom instruction with 20 hours at clinical sites. Qualifying students sit for the following certifications: EMT-Basic and American Heart CPR. Prerequisite: High School Diploma/GED, Current Ohio Driver's License, passing score on entrance exam and current physical.



Firefighter Classes

Hard work, long hours of training, dedication and a sincere desire to help others – welcome to being a firefighter. A variety of classes are offered for the new as well as veteran firefighter who needs to recertify. Examples include: Firefighter I and II, 36-Hour Volunteer, and Emergency Vehicle Operator Course. HVAC is always in need of good technicians and installers for this demanding field. Learn the concepts of basic electricity, fundamentals of refrigeration, basic piping and tubing, tools and equipment, forced-air heating systems, hydronics and geothermal heating so you can work as a Service Technician and Installer in the HVAC field. Qualifying students sit for the Industry Competency Exam (ICE), EPA 608, OSHA, and CPR certifications. College credit is available through Career Technical Credit Transfer (CT)².

This course begins your career with electrical maintenance utilizing the fundamentals of AC/DC, circuit control and protection, safety, magnetism and induction. You are prepped for a career in residential or commercial electrical work and this class is a great starting point for either field.

Residential Electricity Truly Electrifying Work

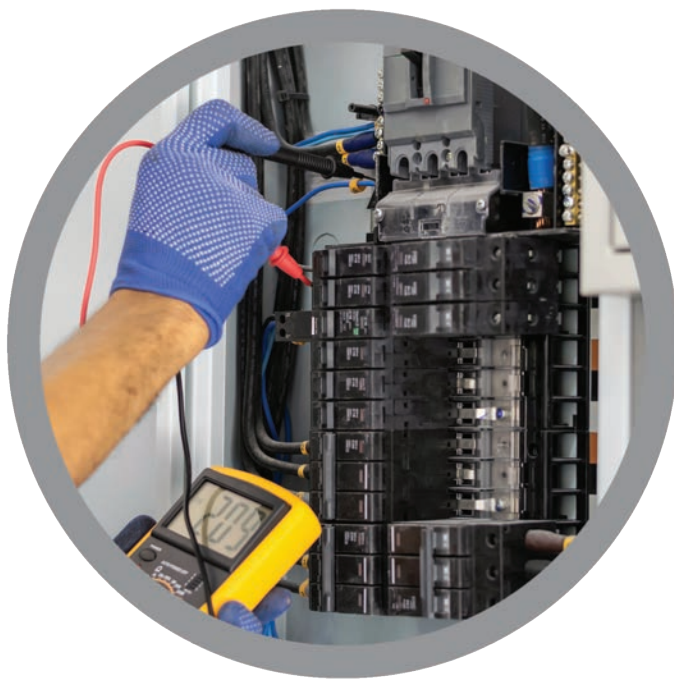
