In Medina County Career Center's Animal Management and Care program, students learn proper nutrition, care, grooming, disease prevention and treatment of domestic and companion animals. They also learn horse care, tack identification, and English and Western riding in our Equine Center, and are trained in animal health and veterinary assisting. Additionally, students gain skills in customer service, merchandising and advertising by managing an interactive doggie daycare unit.
