Medina County Career Center's new two-year Criminal Justice program is launching at the beginning of the 2019 school year. It will provide students with education and training in forensic science, homeland security, law enforcement, public safety and more. Students will gain communication, human relations, reporting and patrolling skills. They will practice subject control and firearm safety and gain knowledge about terrorism awareness and accident and crime scene investigation.
