(SOC Code 33-2010) Employment of firefighters is projected to grow 4 percent from 2023 to 2033. About 26,400 openings for firefighters are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire. The median income for firefighters in Ohio is \$57,120.
