The Vision Care program teaches students about common eye disorders and how to test for visual acuity, depth perception and color blindness, and proper use of optical instruments, as well as prescription analysis and fitting technologies.

Curriculum:

- Anatomy and physiology of the eye
- Basics of ocular surgery
- Ethics and scope of practice
- Fitting technologies
- Identification and treatment of ocular injuries
- Local vision/hearing screening
- On-site optical clinic

- American Board of Optometry [ABO] Exam
- CPR / First Aid
- Optician Pre-Apprenticeship
- OSHA 10-Hour: Healthcare

Work with a licensed optician for 1000 hours and pass the ABO Exam to become a licensed Optician.
