







CONSTRUCTION TRADES

The Medina County Career Center's Construction Trades program teaches students basic carpentry skills to repair, construct and remodel buildings and homes in a real-world setting. Students lay out floors, walls, and rafters, and learn how to construct stairs as well as hang and finish drywall. This program also offers an introduction to basic plumbing and electrical.
